**Bonus Love Language: Pebbling is** a love language inspired by the behavior of penguins. Male Gentoo penguins offer female penguins small stones or pebbles as a way to attract a partner and help build their nests. In human context, pebbling involves collecting, gifting, and arranging small stones or objects to convey emotion and connection. While we humans don't typically demonstrate love through rocks, we pebble our partners by making them a playlist or buying adorable knick-knacks. Receiving a pebble makes you feel seen in the smallest of ways. This a non-verbal love language. This is more common with neurodivergent and autistic

individuals.
