As Suicide Prevention Month ends, we would like to highlight some statistics on a few special populations that are at an increased risk of suicide.

LGBTQ Youth:

41% of LGBTQ youth considered suicide in 2022, including half of transgender and nonbinary youth. LGBTQ youth of color reported higher rates than their white peers.

BIPOC:

People who were American Indian or Alaska Native had a 26% increase in suicide rate between 2018 and 2021. Black individuals saw a 19% increase and the suicide rate among Hispanics increased by nearly 7%.

People with Disabilities:

A survey in 2021 found that people with disabilities were 3x more likely to report suicidal ideation in the prior month compared to people without disabilities.

National Hispanic Heritage Month

In America, National Hispanic Heritage Month is observed from September 15th to October 15th to celebrate the histories, cultures, and contributions of Americans whose ancestors came from Spain, Mexico, the Caribbean and Central and South America.

Hispanic Heritage Week was first observed in 1968, and was expanded to a month-long celebration in 1988. The 30 days between September 15th and October 15th holds significance because the Latin American countries of Mexico, Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua, and Chile all celebrate their independence days during that time.
